

## Important information

### Notes, conditions and guidance on the bursaries and scholarships.

This should be read in conjunction with the individual information on Bursaries and Scholarships available on the University's Student Finance pages.

## General – all awards

1. Students may receive a maximum of **two** awards each academic session.
2. Where possible and unless otherwise stated, payments of awards will be made in the February of each academic year.

Payments for eligible:

- **continuing students** who commenced their programmes of study in academic year 2006/07 to academic year 2009/10 will be made directly by the University.
  - **new students** commencing programmes in September 2010 will receive their payments for the Mandatory, Progression, Partner and UCAS awards via the Student Loan Company's HEBSS (Higher Education Bursary and Scholarships Scheme). **Students must ensure that they have agreed to 'Consent to Share' on their student finance Support application.** The remaining awards will be paid directly by the University directly.
3. Students who fail to progress successfully to the next stage of their programme of study:
    - will not receive an award for the repeat period;
    - awards may be reinstated upon successful progression, provided the applicant still meets the set eligibility criteria for the award.
  4. To be eligible to receive awards, students must not be in debt to the university. In addition, if the appropriate chargeable fee is not received by the University in the academic session it is due, any award granted will automatically be rescinded.
  5. Where a Bursary or scholarship is made in the form of a reduction in tuition fee, any such fee reduction will be made before the calculation of the 5 per cent discount for prompt payment of tuition fees.
  6. Application forms received up to and including the last day of April will be considered for an award **unless** otherwise stated, **except for the Mandatory bursary** where students identified by the SLC (Student Loan Company) as meeting our eligibility criteria will be considered up to the last day of the academic year in June.
  7. Awards cannot be made for retrospective years. Students who fail to apply in an academic year for which they were otherwise eligible will not have their award backdated; they can however apply in following years and receive appropriate payments in line with these notes and conditions.
  8. Where documentary evidence is required to support an application, documents must be received at the same time as the application form. Any form not submitted with required evidence will not be considered.

12. The University's decision on eligibility for Bursaries and Scholarships is final. The University will not enter into further correspondence with students once they have been advised as to why they are ineligible for a particular bursary, unless there is a change in circumstances which would alter an applicant's eligibility status.

## Specific criteria for individual awards

13. The **Alumni Progression Bursary** is available to students:

- that progress to postgraduate-level study (excluding all government/research funded programmes),
- having completed an undergraduate degree at one of the university's main campuses (Avery Hill, Greenwich, Guildford or Medway) or one of its partner colleges (as listed in point 9 above, plus West Kent College), where the full published university fee has been paid. Programmes completed at other external colleges do not qualify.
- This bursary is not applicable for repeat years of study.
- Should eligible students fail to request the bursary at the point of initial registration, a request should be made to Student Finance as soon as possible.
- Where fees are paid in full, a refund for the appropriate amount will be made.
- The bursary is applicable to one year's full-time or two years part-time pro-rata fees only.

14. The university will endeavour to make payment of the **Care Leavers Bursary** within 4 working weeks of successful application. Subsequent payments will be made in November each applicable session following successful progression and full re-registration.

Students that fail to progress to the next academic stage will not receive the award for the repeat period. Students taking an unpaid industrial placement year will be required to submit a letter from the placement employer confirming unpaid status. Payment of the final award for graduation ceremony cost will be made upon confirmation of successful completion of the entire programme. Payment will not be made for students who are awarded a fallback certificate.

15. The deadline to apply each academic session for the **David Fussey Choral Exhibition Bursary** is 30 September. Applications received after this date will not be considered until the following academic session. This is due to the tight deadline for auditions, which are held in October each year. Students accepted for audition will be notified by Nick Jenkins, Music Director.

16. The **First Class Honours Bursary** is available to students registering for a postgraduate programme within two academic years of achieving a first class classification for their undergraduate programme. It is also available to MPhil/PhD students that are not in receipt of Government or research funding.

17. Payment of the **Gravesend Rugby Football Club Bursary** is made in two equal instalments in December and April. Further information regarding the level of achieved experience and qualification for the bursary should be directed to Professor Alan Reed, Director of Regional Development.

18. To receive payment of the **Greenwich Partnership Bursary** and **Mature Student Bursary (for eligible continuing students)** who commenced their programmes of study in academic year 2006/07 to academic year

2009/10) in subsequent years, students are required to provide a copy of their final financial notification letter from Student Finance Direct confirming their eligibility to the maximum level of government means-tested maintenance or special support grant. Payments of awards will not be made where students do not receive the maximum entitlement.

19. The **Gurkha Personnel Bursary** is payable for a maximum of three years for undergraduate study and one year for postgraduate study completed full-time. Ex-Serviceman granted Indefinite Leave to Remain (ILR) in the UK that subsequently qualify for the 'Home' rated tuition fees, will not be eligible.

20. The **John McWilliam Bursary** specific programmes of study are:

21. The **Mature Student Bursary** and the **UCAS Scholarship** are not available to students on HND, foundation degree, Initial Teacher Training or NHS-funded programmes, where alternative schemes apply.

22. To be eligible for the **Mature/Mandatory Student Bursary**, students must be aged 25 prior to 1 September of the first academic year of study. Students cannot become eligible upon their 25th birthday during their programme of study.

23. The **Nationality Scholarship** is not applicable to certain programmes within the School of Humanities & Social Sciences. Applicants should refer to the university's International Fees leaflet for clarification. The scholarship is not available for part-time study or for direct entry to elements of postgraduate study where the full programme fee is not payable. The eligible countries for 2010/11 are:

Bangladesh, Barbados, Botswana, Brazil, Cambodia, Colombia, Egypt, Ghana, India, Iran, Iraq, Jamaica, Japan, Jordan, Kenya, North Korea, South Korea, Kuwait, Lebanon, Libya, Malaysia, Mauritius, Mexico, Nepal, Nigeria, Pakistan, Philippines, Russian Federation, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Taiwan, Tanzania, Thailand, Trinidad and Tobago, Turkey, Turkic States, Uganda, United Arab Emirates, Vietnam and Zimbabwe.

Continuing international students that commenced their study prior to 2010/11 should contact Student Finance to ascertain their eligibility.

24. The **Partnership Progression Scholarship** will be awarded to 10 high-achieving students. Awards will be made to the highest 10 applications with a Grade Point Average of a minimum of 70%. Applications for this award must be received by the Funds, Awards and Bursaries team by the last Friday in January to be considered. Applications received after this time will not be considered.

25. Eligible qualifications for the **UCAS Scholarship** score of 300 can have been achieved at any time but must have been achieved within two consecutive years.

26. The **Sir William Boreman's Foundation** is awarded for one academic session only. Students that continue to meet the eligibility criteria may apply each year for further awards. Payments for successful applicants are made following assessment at any point throughout the academic year. The university will endeavour to assess applications and make payment within 4 weeks.
